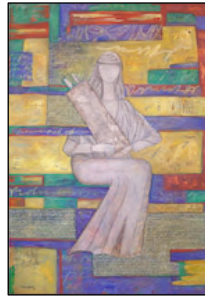

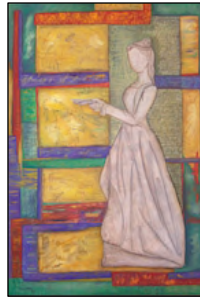

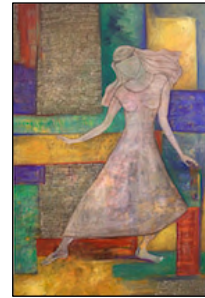

New Mexico Holocaust & Intolerance Museum

The New Mexico Holocaust & Intolerance Museum was opened in 2001 by Holocaust survivor Werner Gellert and Juliana Lerner, and Werner's wife Frankie Gellert. The museum is dedicated to eliminating hate and intolerance through education for adults and young people. Museum exhibits illustrate historical conflicts caused by local, national, and global prejudice. With 50% of its exhibits on the Holocaust, 50% of its space is devoted to other genocides, human rights, and social justice issues.
